



Message from our Chairperson - FPSRMB

Hello All

We hope that everyone had a great Christmas and New Years and are looking forward to the year ahead. The Freds Pass Sport and Recreation Management Board (FPSRMB) wish to continue improving the management of the Reserve and one of the strategies is the introduction of the "Freds Flyer" with the aim to improve the communication between the Board and the Community. This will be coordinated by Raquel Sewell who has been employed in a new administration role and we welcome her onto the team and hope that there is success with this publication.

It was great to finally sign off on the Show Agreement in January, after a lot off negotiation between all parties it has now been made official and can move ahead. I'm sure it is a great relief to the Show Group however it is just as much of relief for the FPSRMB as the process for handing over the Show has been in progress since January 2013. We have finalised the Stable Hire Agreement with NHPC, negotiations commenced early last year, it is a credit to the NHPC and their members. The Agreement that will ensure that the stables are managed effectively going forward.

The Lease Agreement between Litchfield Council and the FPSRMB was negotiated over the course of last year. As a result we have to look at the corresponding arrangements between the FPSRMB and the User Groups. The Licence Agreement clarifies this relationship, so that all parties are protected and are clear on their requirements and duties, as well as identifying the User Group fees. Over the next two or three months we will speak to all User Groups individually and go through the Licence Agreement, providing everyone with ample notice prior to the documents instigation on the 1st of January 2015. The FPSRMB have also been working on updating the constitution, the final preparations of the document are almost complete, and after six months work we hope to have a document that is acceptable to the Board and one which we can then present to the User Groups for ratification. There is still some work to be done before the document will be finalised formally, however there is light at the end of the tunnel.

The User Groups will be contacted by Sharyn Innes asking to meet to discuss the Freds Pass Reserve Strategic and Master Plans, this a very exciting time for the Board as this has been an agenda item for some time now and it is finally coming to fruition. The Strategic and Master Plans are being developed from the input of the Reserves many stakeholders. It will provide the Reserve with a fresh insight as a result of the various perspectives, it will enable us to clearly identify the challenges we have ahead, while coming up with ways to solve old problems as well as recognising that there will be alternatives beyond our current resources, and we hope that all concern get on board and dare to bold.

Finally, thanks to Dirk Bakker and his team for their continued hard work and support towards the future of the Reserve and a special thanks to the Board Members for their unrelenting dedication to the Reserve.

Something To Think About

A father left 17 camels as an asset to his three sons. When the father passed away, his sons read his Will. The Will stated that the eldest son should get 1/2(half) of the total camels, while the middle son should be given a 1/3rd (one third), and the youngest son should be given 1/9th(one ninth) of the total camels. As it was not possible to divide 17 into half or 17 by 3 or 17 by 9, and the three sons started to fight with each other. They then decided to go to a wise man. The wise man read the Will patiently. After giving it due thought, he brought one camel of his own and added it to the 17 camels. That increased the total to 18 camels. Then he started reading the deceased father's Will:

- Half of 18=9. So he gave the eldest son 9 camels.
- 1/3rd of 18=6. So he gave the middle son 6 camels. 1/9th of 18=2. So he gave the youngest son 2 camels.

Now add this up:9+6+2=17. That leaves one camel which the wise man took back.

Moral of the story: The attitude of negotiation and problem solving is to find the 18th camel, i.e. The common ground. Once a person is able to find the 18th camel the issue is resolved. It is difficult at times, however, to reach a solution, the first step is to believe that there is a solution. If we think that there is no solution, we won't be able to reach any!
