BACKGROUND

With the increasing number of people residing in the Darwin rural area, and in pursuit of its long standing policy to enable local people to determine their local affairs, the Northern Territory Government recognised a need to examine options for a form of Local Government to be established there.

As a result of this initiative, the Darwin Rural Advisory Council was formed by the then Minister for Community Development, the Hon Ian Tuxworth MLA, in March 1983 to consider various options. This Council consisted of the following members:

The inaugural meeting was held on 17 March 1983 at the Freds Pass Community Hall. Following many meetings and widespread consultations, the final report was presented to the Hon Daryl Manzie MLA, Minister for Community Development, on 22 June 1984.

The report was subsequently circulated for public comment, with 33 public responses being received, resulting in considerable public debate. The report's findings were not unanimously accepted; however, some general principles did receive widespread community support. These principles were:

- neither the Darwin City Council, nor the Palmerston Town Council boundaries be extended over the rural area;
- (2) the level of municipal service provision be in accordance with the rural lifestyle needs;
- (3) the imposition of rates in the immediate future was inevitable; and
- (4) the rating system must be equitable.

Following widespread consultations with community groups and residents, Cabinet approved in principle on 24 May 1985, the establishment of Local Government in the outer Darwin rural area. A further Cabinet decision on 3 September 1985 approved the constitution of a new municipality to consist of four wards, with elections for one alderman from each ward, and a mayor from the whole of the Shire, to be held on 7 December 1985. (The Local Government Act was subsequently amended to permit the Council to alter the members' titles to president and councillors, with effect from 1 July 1986).

The Council at a special general meeting on 1 October 1986 formulated the Litchfield Shire Local Government Establishment Package bid which was forwarded to the Department of Community Development on 10 October 1986. On 19 March 1987, the Department of Community Development was abolished, with responsibility for local government matters being transferred to the newly created Office of Local Government, within the portfolio of the Treasurer and Minister for Local Government, the Hon Barry Coulter MLA. On 27 November 1987, the Office of Local Government was transferred to the Department of Labour and Administrative Services within the portfolio of the Hon Terry McCarthy MLA.

Over the next 10 months, the Establishment Package was negotiated through a series of inter-governmental officer level working party meetings. This resulted in the Council's final submission being received by the Office of Local Government on 26 August 1987.

The Package was approved by the Northern Territory Government on 29 March 1988. The Minister, the Hon Terry McCarthy MLA, advised the Litchfield Shire Council President, Mr John Maley, of Cabinet's decision on 13 April 1988 and the Council accepted the package by its letter of 5 May 1988.

The implementation of this Establishment Package ensures that the Litchfield Shire Council has adequate resources to implement and maintain an equitable level of municipal services throughout the community. This, combined with the strong community spirit that is evident throughout the municipality, together with its motto "Community effort is essential", will ensure continued growth and prosperity.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ESTABLISHMENT PACKAGE:

Nothing in this package precludes the Council from making submissions to the Minister for special financial Grants on the basis of any special needs it perceives.

- 1. The Litchfield Shire Council to have full local government powers in accordance with section 84 of the Local Government Act.
- The Northern Territory Government will adjust the current planning boundaries in such a manner as to have the Shire in its entirety placed in a singular planning area under the provisions of the Planning Act.
- 3. The Northern Territory Government shall fully consult the Shire Council before it provides facilities within the Shire which the Council may be required to maintain.
- The Northern Territory Government accept the Shire Road Policy as adopted by Council. Further that all scheduled B roads (refer appendix 'A') be brought up to standard in 5 years with total funding for this project being provided for by the Northern Territory Government.
- The Northern Territory Government institute suitable legislative action to ensure that development of subdivisions are only approved after taking into account the impact that subdivision will have on existing or future road networks and where it is deemed necessary by the Planning Authority ensure total funding to upgrade headworks external to the subdivision where necessary.
- The Northern Territory Government recognises that any savings in costs in administering the Litchfield Shire Council caused by the size and efficiency of the Shire which will not reduce the level of Government Funding to area.

- 7. The Northern Territory Government will provide a full range of Government facilities and services in keeping with the growth rate of the Shire.
- The Northern Territory Government to fully fund the building of municipal facilities throughout the Shire.
- The Litchfield Shire Council in conjunction with the Northern Territory Government identify suitable land for the provisions of the above facilities and initiate the necessary action to ensure the identified land is vested in the Council by freehold title as soon as possible. (refer appendix 'B')
- The Northern Territory Government will fund the cost of maintaining any specific facilities provided for before the establishment of the Shire which are in excess of those normall maintained by the other municipalities and the other communitie throughout the Northern Territory. The comparison to be based upon a formula of equalisation of funding by the Northern Territory Government for similar facilities with an emphasis on regional requirements.
- 11. The Northern Territory Government provide land and funding for establishing Rubbish Dumps at Lambells Lagoon and Noonamah areas in the immediate future and as necessary on a staged basis in keeping with the development of the Shire.
- The Northern Territory Government fund the balance of loan owing on Caretakers residence at Fred's Pass Reserve as at 1st January, 1986, if not funded by the N.T. Grants Committee.
- 13. The Northern Territory Government establish or provide funding for Temporary Demountable Accommodation at Fred's Pass Reserve pending the development of a permanent Shire Office if not funded by the N.T. Grants Committee.
- The Northern Territory Government provide for Administration Equipment costs towards the establishment of the Shire. This funding not to be less than \$100,000.00. (refer appendix 'C')
- The Northern Territory Government fund the legal expenses for transfer of title of Reserves and compilation of assets registers to operate the day to day management of Reserves when and if applicable.

16. The Northern Territory Government give freehold title to the areas known as:

The Burnt Paddock - Knuckeys Lagoon
The Livingstone Reserve - 34 Mile
The McMinns Recreation Area - McMinns Lagoon
Fred's Pass Reserve - 30km Stuart Highway
Humpty Doo Village Green - Humpty Doo
Berry Springs Reserve - Berry Springs
(refer appendix 'D')

Other open areas are appropriate from time to time commensurate with the growth of the Shire and provide all necessary establishment costs.

- 17. That the Shire of Litchfield receive special additional funding to the full extent of its rate revenue in 86/87 to allow it to establish adequate funds for future operations, in a similar manner to that provided for Katherine and Tennant Creek.
- The Northern Territory Government provide land and/or funding for the housing for Senior Council Staff to the same extent as will be provided to Palmerston Town Council.
- The Northern Territory Government provide a compatible interface between the N.T. Government computer facility and the proposed Litchfield Shire Council computer system when appropriate.
- 20. Litchfield Shire Council is to be consent authority for roads and stormwater drainage works, is to be fully involved in all stages of the land development process, shall be consulted on all proposed land developments and shall be able to insist on minimum standards being applied in the Litchfield Shire.
- 21. Litchfield Shire Council to have the right to inspect roads and stormwater drainage works by both Developers and the Government during construction of these works.
- 22. Litchfield Shire Council to have the right to reject roads and stormwater drainage works that are not up to standard at the handover stage whether these works are constructed by the Developers or the Government.
- Litchfield Shire Council to be the approving authority for all development applications under the provisions of the Planning Act in relation to roadworks and stormwater drainage.

- 24. To transfer land free of cost to Council and to fund the construction of a permanent municipal office on a staged basis by 30 June 1996, to provide a reasonable standard of this facility for the Shire's population at that date. This to commence with the provision of stage 1, being permanent office accommodation within this financial year.
- 25. That the Northern Territory Government realise the future needs of the Litchfield Shire Council in relation to tourism and consequently transfer title, free of charge, to areas of land that can be identified as future tourism parks by the Litchfield Shire Council.
- 26. The Northern Territory Government shall change existing legislation to enable Litchfield Shire Council to apply a Flat Rate system.

RESOLVED that a Council Committee comprising President Maley and not less than two other Councillors be delegated to negotiate the Establishment Package with the Northern Territory Government.

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(A) INTRODUCTION

The Litchfield Shire was formally established on the 6th September, 1985 by a Government Gazettal notice with the Council being elected on the 7th December of the same year. With the Establishment of the Litchfield Shire Council negotiations between the newly formed Council and the Northern Territory Government were started. From these negotiations it was mutually aggeed that, as was done with other newly established Local Government Bodies within the Northern Territory, the Litchfield Shire Council would submit to the Northern Territory Government an "Establishment Package" where this package was to assist the New Council in establishing its infra structure from which it would operate, provide for any necessary legislative changes, assist in meeting initial financial burdens and in funding importanted problems which were not remedied by the Northern Territory Government before the Establishment of the Council.

After a series of internal meetings, the Litchfield Shire Council on the 1st October 1986 held a Special Meeting at which its Local Government Establishment Package was formulated and Which was subsequently submitted to the Northern Territory Government for consideration.

As a result of the first document presentation, a series of officer level working party meetings and planning meetings (fovelving the Department of Lands and Housing) have occurred where discussions and dissection of all items in the package cook place.

This is now the culmination of all those discussions and the Ginal submission of the Council to the Northern Territory Government.

(A) PART 1

The Litchfield Shire Council's Establishment Package final submission to the Northern Territory Government.

The Literafield Shire Council to have full Local Government powers in accordance with Section 84 of the Local Government Act with the proviso that Council and not the Northern Territory Covernment, will decide on the timing and level of service of each Eunction it chooses to assume.

At this stage in time, the Litchfield Shire Council wants only those Focal Government Powers, as set out below, in accordance with Section 84 of the Local Government Act. The Litchfield Shire Council will from time to time, as it sees fit, take on other Local Government Functions at its own discretion.

Council requires the following Local Government Functions;

 - (iii) the whole parcel of land fronting the southwest side of the Stuart Highway, and otherwise bounded by Bees Creek Road, Bees Creek, for a council office and depot;
 - (iv) Livingstone Reserve 34 mile Lot 2229

 - (v) McMinns Recreation Area McMinns Lagoon -Section 1708, Hundred of Strangways (re-numbered Section 2211);
 - /(vi) Freds Pass Reserve 30 km Stuart Highway Sections 1709 and 1724, Hundred of Strangways
 (combined and re-numbered Section 1801);

- (vii) Humpty Doo Village Green Humpty Doo Section 1799, Hundred of Strangways;
- (viii) Howard Park Portion 1916, Whitewood Road, Hundred of Bagot.
- D. Grants of land in leasehold for new and existing refuse dumps for the balance of their period of operation at:
 - (i) Humpty Doo (Portion 1725);
 - (ii) Berry Springs (part Portion 1578);
 - (iii) Howard Springs (part Portion 200);
 - (iv) New sites for two nominated localities and Howard Springs, subject to the availability of suitable sites.
- E. The Minister for Lands & Housing will create a single planning area covering the Litchfield Shire, excepting the proposed new town of Weddell, to be subject to a separate consent Authority constituted under section 35 of the Planning Act.
- F. The implementation of a sequential numbering system of allotments in Litchfield Shire will be undertaken by the Department of Lands & Housing in 1988.
- G. The Government agreed that nothing in the Establishment Package precludes the Council from making submissions to the Government for special financial grants on a needs basis.
- H. The Government agreed to the following items in the Council's formal Establishment Package bid, as noted:
 - Item 1 The Council shall have all the functions of Local Government listed in Schedule 2 of the Local Government Act, except Town Planning and Building. As all functions are discretionary, not obligatory, it will be Council's responsibility to decide which functions it chooses to perform.
 - Item 2 Refer to E above.
 - Item 3 The Government shall fully consult with the Council before it provides facilities within the Shire which the Council may be required to maintain.
 - Item 4 The Government's position is that the Council's Roads Policy is its own responsibility, not requiring acceptance or otherwise by the Government. Further, that the Council's decision to extend the maintained road network by 40.3km is its own responsibility.

- Item 5 The Minister for Lands & Housing will undertake appropriate rectification action to ensure that subdivisional developments are only approved after taking into account the impact that subdivisions will have on existing and future road networks, and where it is deemed necessary by the Planning Authority, ensure total funding upgrade headworks external to ťο subdivision where necessary. However, Government recognises the limitations placed on the ability of a consent authority to require works external to a subdivision, by virtue of legal precedent and the need to allow proper operation of appeal mechanisms.
- Item 6 The Government agrees that any savings in costs in administering the Litchfield Shire caused by the size and efficiency of the Council, relative to other councils, will not reduce the level of funding to it. The principle is contained within the Local Government Grants Commission legislation.
- Item 7 The Government will provide an appropriate range of facilities and services in keeping with the growth rate of the Shire, subject to budgeting constraints, as with any municipality.
- Item 8 The Government's funding commitments for municipal facilities are fulfilled in specific items in this Package, particularly Items 4, 9, 11, 16, 18 and 24.
- Item 9 Council applications for land (other than land covered in Items 11 and 16) will be dealt with in accordance with the Government's municipal land tenure policy.
- Item 10 The Government agrees in principal to funding maintenance costs of specific facilities provided before the establishment of the Shire which are in excess of those normally maintained by other municipalities, where it is agreed that the services be continued. A decision will be made on any specific application made by the Council.
- Item 11 The Government favours the continuation of landfill dumping at Humpty Doo, Berry Springs and Howard Springs. Refer also to D and A(ii) above.
- Item 12 Item withdrawn on the consent of the Council.
- Item 13 Item withdrawn on the consent of the Council.
- Item 14 Item withdrawn on the consent of the Council.

- Item 15 The Government will transfer to the Council at nil cost the freehold titles to the land listed in Item 16. However, the Government will not be responsible for the cost of compilation of asset registers of reserves.
- Item 16 The Government agrees to transfer to the Council at nil cost the freehold titles for:
 - (a) Livingstone Reserve
 - (b) McMinns Recreation Area
 - (c) Freds Pass Reserve
 - (d) Humpty Doo Village Green
 - (e) Howard Park

as described in C(iv)-(viii) above.

Transfer of titles will not occur for:

- (f) Knuckey Lagoons, part Sections 34 & 109 (without further justification)
- (g) Lambells Lagoon, part Portion 1625
- (h) Berry Springs Reserve, Section 1789, Hundred of Ayres, and Section 1544, Hundred of Cavenagh. (See NOTE 2, page 5)

Future land applications will be determined in accordance with the Government's municipal land tenure policy. Future funding for Council's operation of reserves is within the jurisdiction of the Local Government Grants Commission.

- Item 17 Item withdrawn on the consent of the Council.
- Item 18 The Government agrees to the provision of land at Humpty Doo for municipal purposes as outlined in C(ii) above.
- Item 19 Item withdrawn on the consent of the Council.
- Item 20 The Council is to be the accepting authority for section 91(1), Local Government Act, roads, and for parks, stormwater drainage and landscaping thereon, constructed to the standards previously determined in accordance with the planning processes.
- Item 21 The Council has the right to inspect, as per existing procedure, roads and stormwater drainage construction by both developers and the Government (with the exception of section 91(2) roads, ie. Territory roads).
- Item 22 The Council has the right to reject road and stormwater drainage works that are not up to standard at the handover stage, whether these works have been constructed by developers or the Government (with the exception of section 91(2) roads, ie. Territory roads).

- Item 23 The Council will be the accepting authority for development applications under the provisions of the Planning Act in relation to roadworks and stormwater drainage (with the exception of section 91(2) roads), as a result of Items 20-22.
- Item 24 The Government agrees to funding for municipal offices refer to A(iii) above with the following conditions:
 - (i) the Government's preferred option for commercial development is at Humpty Doo;
 - (ii) priority for capital works programming,
 planning and expenditure will remain
 centred at Humpty Doo;
 - (iii) <u>all</u> servicing costs of locating the municipal offices at Freds Pass will be met by council scheduled capital works to service land at Humpty Doo will not be relocated to Freds Pass; and
 - (iv) access from the municipal office site at Freds Pass will not be allowed directly onto the Stuart Highway.
- Item 25 Item withdrawn on the consent of the Council.
- Item 26 The Government will restore the "flat rate" option in the 1988 review and amendment of the Local Government Act.
- Item 27 Item withdrawn on the consent of the Council.
- Item 28 Refer to F above.
- NOTE 1: Wherever possible, the actual wording used in the Litchfield Shire Council's final submission for the Establishment Package has been retained in this presentation.
- NOTE 2: Following negotiation, the title for the Berry Springs Reserve, Section 1789 Hundred of Ayres, was registered in the Council's name by the Department of Lands and Housing on 14 October 1988.

It is with much pleasure I advise that Cabinet has approved a Local Government Establishment Package for the Litchfield Shire Council.

The package, which has been the subject of detailed negotiations between officers of my Department, Lands, Transport and Works, the Treasury and your Council amounts to some \$11.565 million. In addition, grants of land for a council office and depot, a sub-depot and other municipal purposes have been provided. Recreation reserves, in keeping with the government's municipal land tenure policy are already in the process of being granted. Dump sites have also been approved in Crown lease term to allow for existing dumps for the balance of their period of operation and new sites for two nominated localities and at Howard Springs subject to the availability of suitable sites.

Cabinet has agreed to the transfer of freehold title to recreation reserves without cost but has not agreed to the cost of compilation of asset registers. Cabinet has not supported the granting of reserves at Knuckey Lagoons, Lambells Lagoon or the Berry Springs extension areas. However, future land applications will be determined in accordance with the Government's land tenure policy to municipal bodies.

Cabinet has determined that Litchfield Shire Council should have all functions listed in Schedule 2 of the Local Government Act except Town Planning and Building, and this is to be in common with all other municipal councils. This will enable the council of the day to decide on the timing and level of service of each function it chooses to assume.

Special purpose grants have been approved to provide for remedial road works over two years (\$900,000), construction of a municipal office and depot (\$600,000) and the future provision of waste transfer stations when appropriate (\$340,000). Roads, associated drainage and dumps recurrent funding has been approved at a level of \$745,000 per annum indexed to CPI for five years commencing 1987/88 and for capital improvements totalling \$6 million over ten years. These levels are inclusive of the Council's share of the Commonwealth Specific Purpose Payments component in relation to road funding.

As I have previously advised, the Government intends restoring the "flat rate" option to municipal councils in the current review of the Local Government Act.

Further, the Government has given an undertaking that the Minister for Lands and Housing will create a single planning area covering the Litchfield Shire with the exception of the proposed new town of Weddell which is to be subject to a separate Consent Authority constituted under section 35 of the Planning Act.

The Department of Lands and Housing will also be introducing the sequential numbering system of streets in the Shire and this should commence this financial year. For further detailed information on the establishment package approved by Cabinet, officers of the Office of Local Government will be available to provide that information.

On behalf of the Government, I congratulate the Council on the outcome of these negotiations and I am of the view that the package gives the Litchfield Shire Council a generous and solid financial basis for the future.
