

What's a PIC and do you need one?

If you keep livestock on your block or in your backyard, you **MUST** register for a **Property Identification Code** (PIC)

Do you keep livestock on your block?

Cattle, buffalo, horses (including mules and donkeys), pigs, poultry, deer, llamas, camels, alpacas, sheep, goats and beehives are all classified as livestock.

Do you have a Property Identification Code?

If you have any of the above animals, even just one as a pet, no matter how big or small your property is, then you need a Property Identification Code. Registering for a PIC is easy and free - register online at nt.gov.au or ask your Regional Livestock Biosecurity Officer how to register today!

Did you know certain requirements apply when moving livestock?

When moving livestock within the NT, you need to meet the following requirements:
