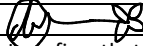

I'm a North Ward Councillor at Litchfield Council, an Army Reserve Education Officer, and Managing Director of a Territory business. I live at Howard Springs, in a fast-growing rural municipality, and my work takes me across the Territory, to regional centres and remote communities.

Talking with elected members and staff from other councils, the same issues come up wherever you are: funding that doesn't stretch far enough, roads, workforce, and getting genuine support from the other two spheres of government. The proportions differ. The problems are shared.

That is the case for LGANT. We are eighteen councils solving the same problems eighteen times over. I want us working smarter, not harder and LGANT is the strongest mechanism we have for shared solutions on the things that are our core business: roads, rubbish, and housing for our remote councils. Where one council has cracked something, the rest of us shouldn't be starting from scratch.

I bring governance as well as ideas: ASIC-registered director, member of the Development Consent Authority, chair of a council reserve committee, and qualifications in Indigenous education, leadership and government. I understand the Corporations Act duties this Board carries.

If elected as a Municipal Director, I won't treat it as a municipal-only mandate. Advocacy only works if it carries regional and shire realities as well as urban ones, otherwise it doesn't speak for the sector.
